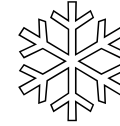

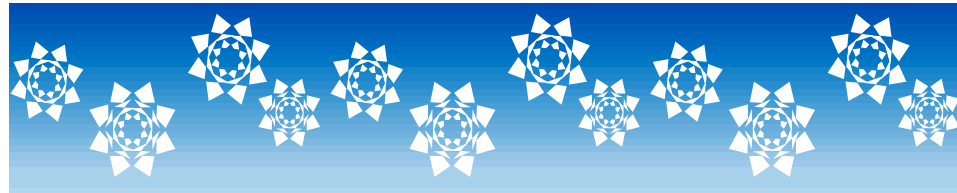

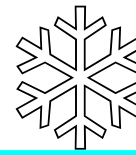

### **Chicken and Wild Rice Chowder**

#### *Ingredients*

- 2 cups sliced fresh carrots
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped celery
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 cans (14-1/2 oz each) Chicken Broth
- 2-2/3 cups cubed cooked chicken breast
- 1/4 cup half-and-half cream
- 1 package (8.8 ounces) ready-to-serve long grain and wild rice
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper

#### *Directions*

In a large saucepan, sauté the carrots, onion and celery in butter until tender. Stir in flour until blended; gradually add broth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Stir in the chicken, rice, cream and pepper; heat through. **Yield:** 4 servings.

Matthew 25 opened its doors in Lititz in August, 2000. The shop was established to engender funds that would help meet emergency needs, primarily those of Lancaster County residents.

Matthew 25 is an ecumenical effort staffed by volunteers from area churches and the community at large. The shop is stocked entirely by donations of gently used and new clothing for men, women and children, household goods and books. Each month, the board of directors disburses funds from the shop's proceeds to area agencies, churches, and service and charitable organizations. To date, they have donated more than \$1,500,000 to meet special needs.

This month, the board elected to give \$1,000 to East Fairview, for emergency needs in the congregation. Please Remember Matthew 25 when you have goods to donate and shopping to be done!
